




#### Set Up Personal Suggestions to Students on a Class Bookshelf




You can add books to your class book shelf. Search for books that are part of the selected novels for this unit.



Notice that when a selected book comes up, the Lexile Reading level is given. You can check the correlation to Guided Reading levels by choosing the Reading Level tab and reviewing the Reading Level Chart.



Then add to your class shelf. You will have to select one or more groups.




Teachers may: Review Book Information, review the book for your students, recommend it to students, or examine the Reading Level information for each book.




Be sure to take some time to review books that you recommend or require for classroom thematic units. Model for students how to do a Book Review, as they will be doing so as well over the course of the unit (and potentially over the course of the year).



You can also Recommend particular books that you want specific students to read. This will be what you do for the Book Clubs.



Students will then get a recommendation on their shelf from you.




Set up Reading Challenges for Your Students. You may wish to do this as part of your book clubs. Reading challenges can be small groups, with select numbers of students or for the whole class. The purpose is to give you updates on the student progress.




#### Click on Start a New challenge




Select students to take part in the challenge or select all students. Be sure to name your challenge and select the books for the challenge. Then **Save** it.




You can track student's progress as they read the books in the challenge.



Books that you suggest for each student's challenge, will appear under the challenges Tab



Students will need to add the books that you suggest for their challenge to their Reading Log.



Teachers can check the progress of students as they read. As logs are visible and student book reviews, this allows teachers to be able to engage and encourage students in their reading.

# **Student Activity in Biblionasium**

Biblionasium is an opportunity for students to exercise Digital Citizenship in a safe environment as they share their love of books and get encouragement to read from teachers and peers.


Students can change their avatar, then get started adding books to their bookshelf. To do so, they can first click on My Books.



After students add to their shelf, they can log time reading. To do so, they just have to click on the book.




Then record the number of minutes or pages.




#### My Challenges and Connecting to Digital Book Clubs


Students can click on a book that you have suggested to them, then add it to their shelf. This allows students to log entries.




After students have added the book to their shelf, they may regularly log entries for reading. These reviews may be printed if needed or even emailed.



In addition to books, students can log any reading material such as comics or magazines.



In addition to logging reading by pages or by minutes, students can even create book reviews.



In addition to this, students can promote books to other classmates that are part of the class that the teacher has set up. Thereby helping to promote literacy and reading among the classroom community.

### **Moderating Reviews**

After a student has completed a review, teachers will need to approve this post before it is shared. Teachers will get a Notification alerting them of the number of posts to moderate.
