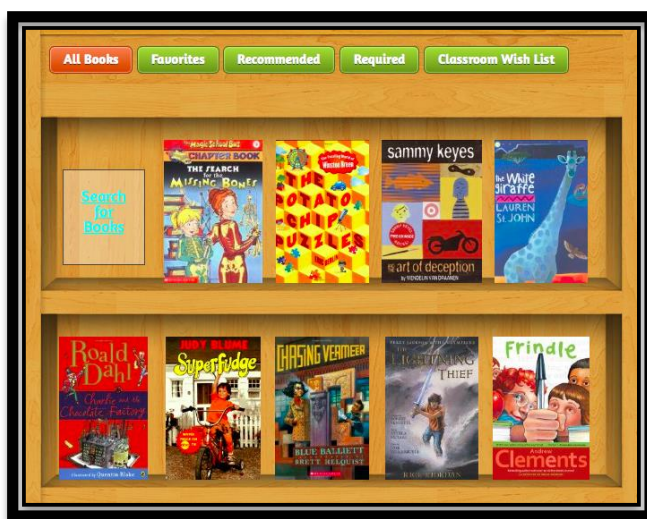
Where Kids Flex Their Reading Muscles

Biblionasium is a powerful social network and platform that promotes and enhances the independent reading process for students ages 6-13.

The platform safely connects students with their teachers, librarians, classmates, friends and parents in order to share book recommendations and to create a virtual village of reading support.

Users can search for books (by title, author, category or even reading level) then add books to their virtual shelf or provide recommendations to others in the network.

Biblionasium provides easy-to-use online reading logs so children can track their reading; log entries can include the date, level, number of pages and length of session. These online reading logs provide teachers and parents with a paperless tool to monitor and assess progress.



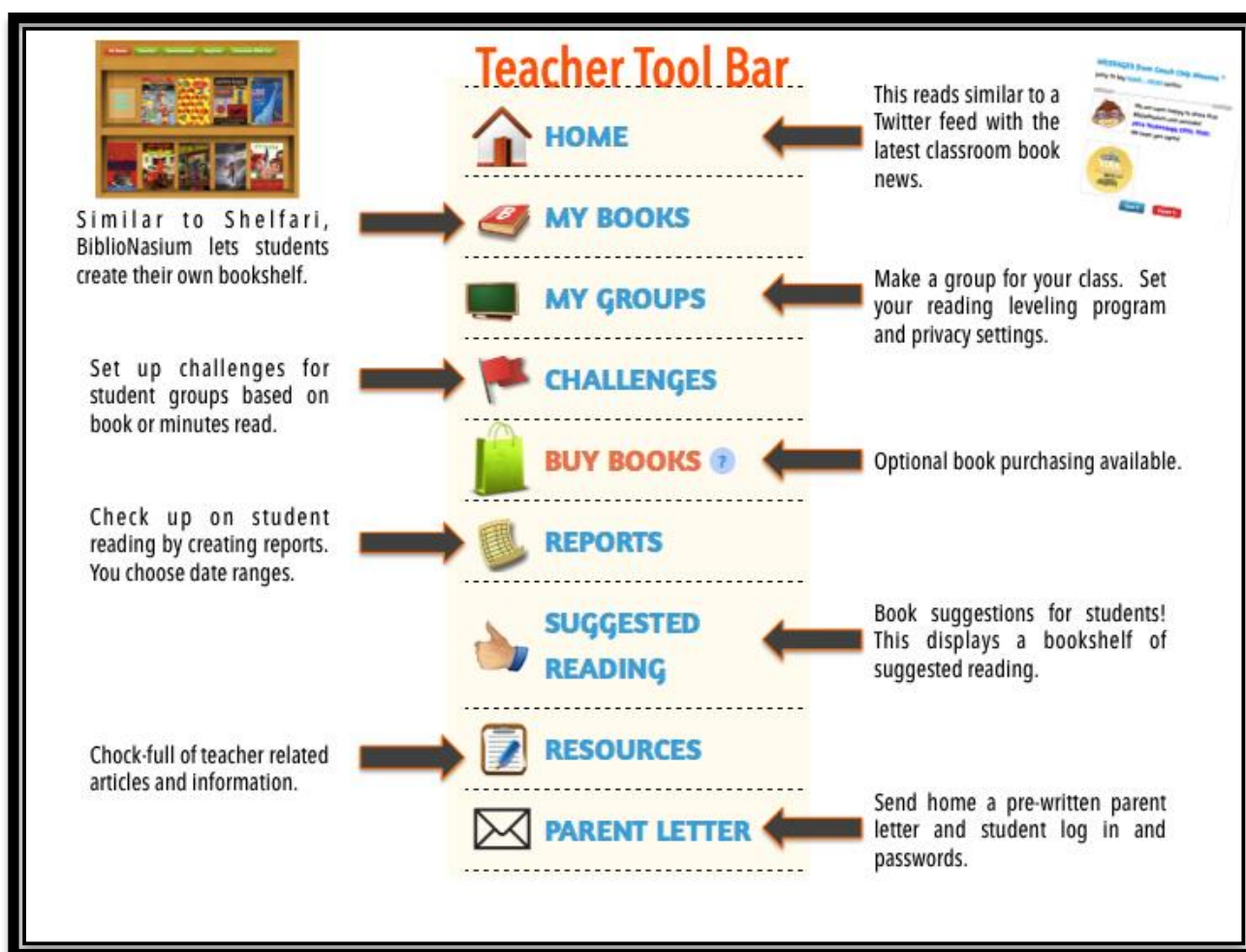
Once students all have profiles they can choose an avatar and get started. Teachers can set up weekly challenges based on books read or minutes read - and students can log their minutes and see how close they are getting to the weekly goal. When they log their minutes, they are also logging the book they are reading and how much is read. At the end of the week or month, teachers can run a report that shows all student reading for the selected time.

That's no paperwork! Minutes are already added! Goals are either met or not met and teachers can see it at a glance!

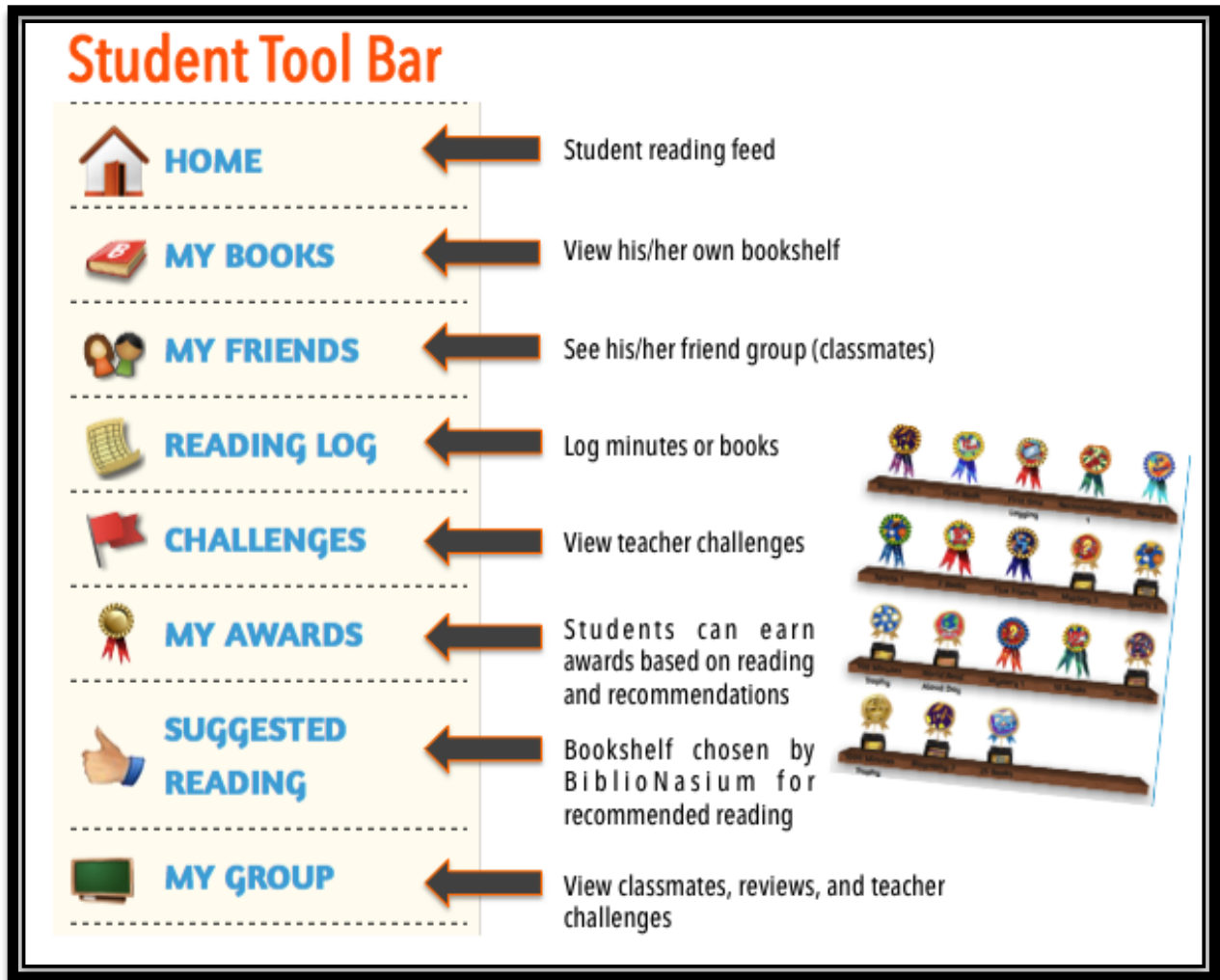


Students have the opportunity to write recommendations and recommend books to friends. These show up in the teacher's live newsfeed on the front page. The newsfeed usually shows a post from Biblionasium- it could be a book recommendation or an article about reading or just a picture and caption for reading fun. There is typically a new Biblionasium post every day or so. Teachers can choose to delete anything in their feed after it is read.

Students can earn awards when they log in, make a recommendation, etc. Depending on a teacher's settings, students can share recommendations. They can log their minutes and books, create their own bookshelf of books they have read or want to read, and interact with their classmates for reading purposes.



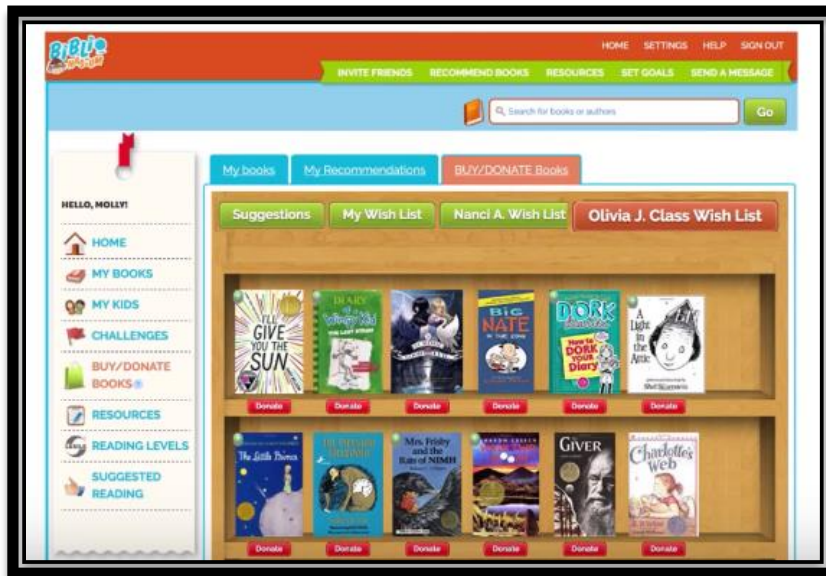
A badge on the right will keep track of their books and minutes read since they started logging.

This means students are not just logging their reading, but they are interacting with it as well!

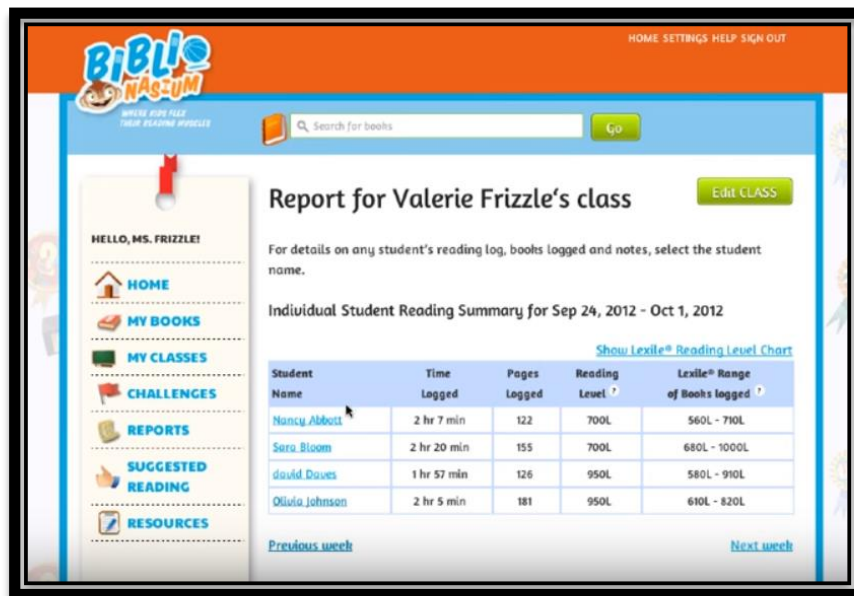
Teachers may want to log in during class time just so students can see some of the book recommendations that their classmates have posted. It is a great motivator.

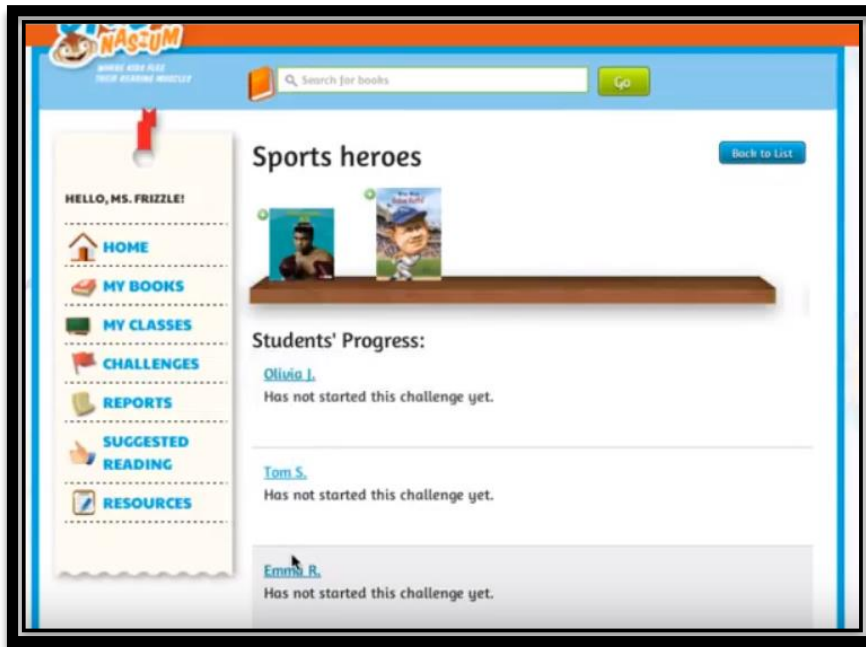

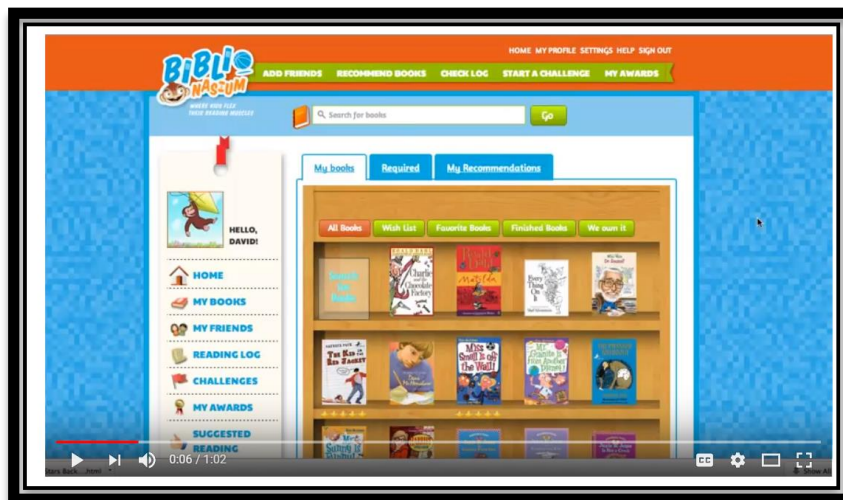

- This feature can be used to recommend specific books to students when running book clubs.

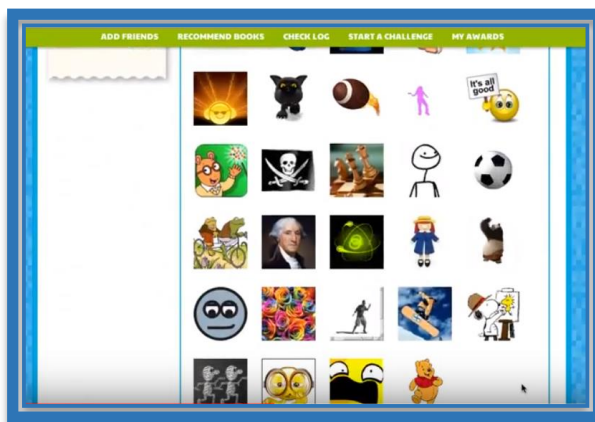

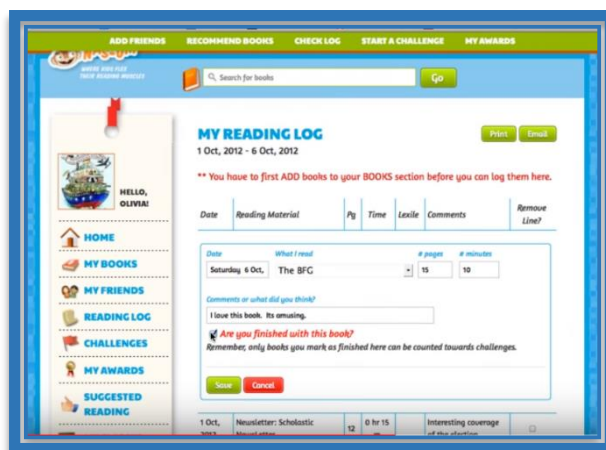

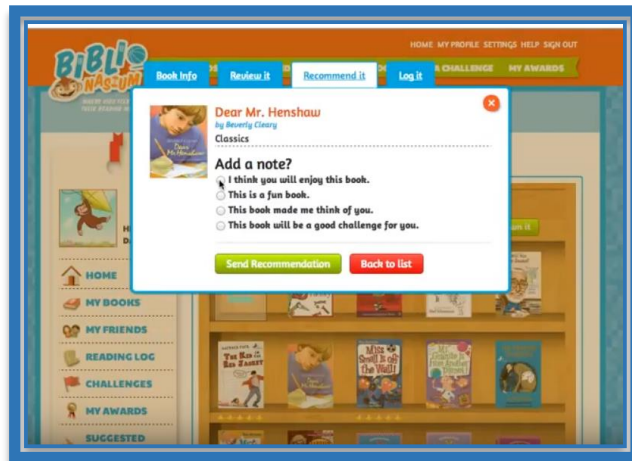
